How do we collect your personal data?

We collect information in the following ways:

Information you give us, about you when you apply for a Decade of Centenaries Clare grant or sign up for a Creative Ireland event or programme or mailing list.

What personal data do we collect from you?

1. Name (first name and last name)
2. Postal address
3. Email address
4. Phone number
5. Bank Details (if receiving grant payments)

How your personal data will be used by Decade of Centenaries Clare

Decade of Centenaries Clare will only process information that is necessary for the purpose for which it has been collected.

Decade of Centenaries Clare will only contact you in connection with Decade of Centenaries grants or services.

If you do not provide us with the information we require, relevant and appropriate to the reason for which we request it, this may prevent you from fully availing of our services.

Will we share your personal data with anyone else?

We share your data with other Clare County Council staff members for the purpose of assessment of grant applications and participation in inter-departmental Decade of Centenaries projects. We also share details with Clare County Council Finance Department for the purpose of the payment of grants.

How long will we retain your personal data?

We will only retain your personal data for as long as is necessary to fulfil the purposes for which we collected it and for as long as we are legally required to under EU or Irish Law. We subscribe to the National Retention Policy for Local Authority Records

We may also maintain a Data Retention Policy which supplements the National Retention Policy.

Personal data provided by you in connection with an event or programme will be erased once the event or programme has ended unless you specifically request these details be retained to inform you of further programmes. You have a right to have your personal information erased provided we do not need to hold it in connection with any of the reasons permitted or required under the law.

Your Data Protection Rights

You have the right to request access to personal data held about you, obtain confirmation as to whether data concerning you exists, be informed of the content and source of data and check its accuracy. In addition, if the data held by us is found to be inaccurate you have the right to change, remove, block, or object to the use of, personal data held by Clare County Council. In certain circumstances blocking access to data may delay or remove access to a service where the data is required by law or for essential purposes related to delivery of a service to you. Please note that to help protect your privacy, we take steps to verify your identity before granting access to personal data.
